Public Comment:

Pat Krebs spoke about the recent article published in the Hummelstown Sun about the history of Campbelltown along with commenting about available grants for the Township to consider.

New Business:

Matt Donahoe, representing the Lawn Fire Company, provided an overview of the plan/grant application to renovate the parking lot/infrastructure at the Lawn Fire Station.

Custer recused himself from this discussion and vote due to holding a position with the Lawn Fire Company.

A motion was made by Bova, seconded by Bucks to approve Resolution 10-2022 associated with the Statewide Local Share Assessment Grant \$162,081.61 request for the Lawn Fire Company parking lot/infrastructure renovations at the Lawn Fire Station.

Old Business:

Discuss was held regarding the future enhancements to the Campbelltown Park. After researching the Township's Marcellus Shale grants earmarked for the Campbelltown Park pavilion, it was determined the bids may require the use of prevailing wages for the quotes for this project. Chairwoman Bucks requested Manager Eberly inquire with the Lebanon County Commissioners to determine if these grants could be transferred the Campbelltown Community Alliance (CCA) to streamline this process.

Chairwoman Bucks also mentioned a portion of the Township's American Rescue Plan Funds could be possibly used for future park enhancements.

Adjournment – There being no more business to discuss, a motion by Custer, second by Bova to adjourn the meeting at 7:30PM. Motion carried.
