COMMUNITY PLANNING MEETING SCHEDULED FOR SEPTEMBER 30, 2014 AT 7:00PM AT THE CAMPBELLTOWN FIRE HALL

Dear South Londonderry Township Resident:

The Board of Supervisors would like to invite you to attend their sixth Community Planning Meeting scheduled for September 30, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at the Campbelltown Fire Hall.

Similar to past years, this meeting is designed to update our citizens on the major issues affecting the Township and to hear what your opinions are. We want to know if we are making decisions that are in the best interest of the community.

The formal presentation will focus on local government and planning issues related to the proposed Renovation and Expansion of the existing Municipal Complex, Campbelltown Green Corridor, Williams Pipeline and Historical Commission Presentations.

The Agenda for this meeting can be found on page 7 in this Newsletter and if there is a subject that you feel that we should be covering, please let us know and we will make every effort to include it as part of the program. We hope that you are able to attend and have your voice heard as we continue to try and move forward as a community.

Historical Commission Preservation Award

The Historical Commission will be presenting its Third Annual Preservation Award to a property owner at our Community Meeting on September 30th and previous recipients of this Award were Joel and Ellanna Gish 750 Colebrook Road and the Salem United Church of Christ in Campbelltown.

Municipal Complex Improvements

In September of 2012, The Township celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the completion of the Campbelltown Elementary School and 2014 marked the 40th year that it has served as the municipal building for South Londonderry Township. In an effort to continue its service to the Township, the Supervisors have authorized a renovation project to energize and modernize the building.

This estimated \$2 million project would expand the police department facilities by expanding and renovating the basement level, new administrative office space and meeting room facilities will be provided on the main level and community rooms for the boy and girl scouts and dance classes will continue to be provided on the second floor. Elevator access to all floors will be provided through an addition to the front of the building that will not take away from the historical significance of it being a former elementary school.

In order to complete the ten month renovation project, the Township administrative and police offices would have to relocate. The most economically feasible location would be to construct a 3,000 square foot addition to the existing maintenance building. The maintenance building, which is located within the park adjacent to the municipal building, was built in the mid 1970's and is used to its capacity. The new \$330,000.00 addition would provide temporary office space, and it also has the potential for additional vehicle and storage space once the renovations to the municipal building are completed. It is estimated that once the financing is in place, the construction of the maintenance garage addition could begin as early as November of 2014 and completed in March of 2015. The renovations to the municipal building would then begin in the Spring of 2015.

Williams Pipeline Project

The following is a copy of the letter that the Board of Supervisors submitted to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission in regards to the Corporation's Atlantic Sunrise Expansion Project:

On behalf of the residents of South Londonderry Township, Lebanon County Pennsylvania, the Board of Supervisors would like to express our apprehension regarding the construction of the proposed William's pipeline through the Township's environmentally sensitive areas which includes all waterways, streams, ponds, springs, wetlands and the potential for the development of sinkholes.

Within the Township, we are very concerned with development and how it impacts our environmentally sensitive areas and have become the first municipality within Lebanon County to have created an Environmental Advisory Committee. This committee is extremely active and progressive in protecting these areas and has even increased the amount of sensitive areas that we have through the planting of meadows.

When development occurs in or near these areas, developers are required to construct a vinyl fence around them to protect them from encroachments. For that reason, we would prefer that the pipeline not be built within the township.

However if the pipeline is constructed through the township, we would like an option in South Londonderry Township where a landowner could opt to have Williams plant the right of way area with native wildflowers. These areas would be maintained by one or two cuttings a year thus qualifying the land to be included as a privately owned natural area joining the 44 landowners who already have protected 182.34 acres of land as part of our Natural Areas Program.

As a result, we would strongly encourage that a meeting be initiated between the Township's Environmental Advisory committee, Board of Supervisors and Williams Partners, L.P. to ensure minimum impact to our sensitive areas. We would also like to be provided with an accurate and precise map of the proposed/ amended route for the pipeline to include all property owner names and roadways. We would be pleased if the end result of this meeting was to not only meet the needs of our residents but to also improve the habitat of our Township.

Campbelltown Green Corridor

For more than a decade the Township has been planning for a passive recreation walkway to enjoy the Township's natural flora and fauna and to allow our residents to walk or bike from Bell Road over to the Square in Campbelltown without crossing or walking along Horseshoe Pike (Route 322). This walkway has been laid out through existing and proposed residential developments and through the Township's purchase of the Campbelltown Community Park property. A map depicting the green corridor will be on display at the September 30th Planning meeting.

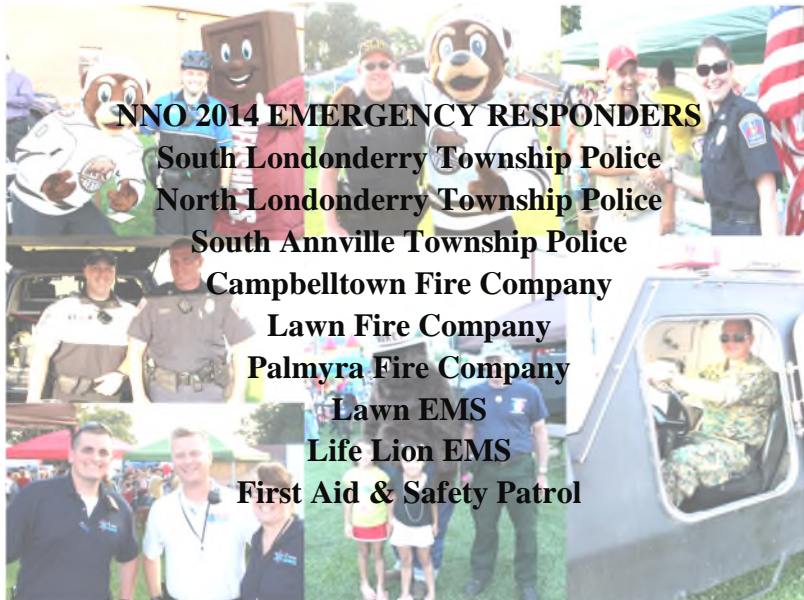
NATIONAL NIGHT OUT NEWS 7th Annual National Night Out

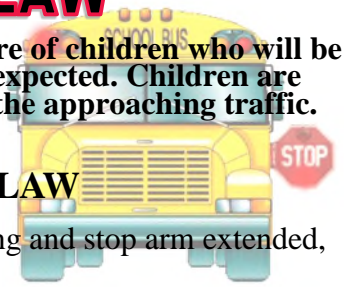

PA SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

With the start of the new school year upon us, motorists are asked to be aware of children who will be walking to and from their schools and bus stops. Drivers must expect the unexpected. Children are sometimes distracted by someone or something and their attention is not on the approaching traffic. Also, be familiar with the following PA School Bus Laws.



PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

- ◆ When you meet or overtake a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you **MUST STOP**.
- ◆ When you approach an intersection where a school bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you **MUST STOP**.
- ◆ You **MUST STOP** at least ten (10) feet away from the school bus.
- ◆ You **MUST WAIT** until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before moving.
- ◆ **DO NOT MOVE** until all the children have reached a place of safety

KNOW YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

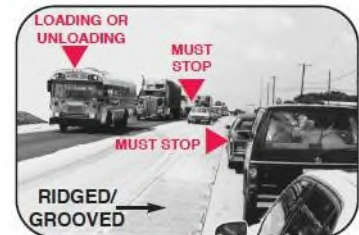
- ◆ 1.5 million children are transported on Pennsylvania roads each day.
- ◆ These children are transported more than 400 million miles to school each year.
- ◆ Every year, children are needlessly injured or killed by drivers passing stopped school buses.



You **MUST STOP** on roadways with painted lines.



You **MUST STOP** at an intersection, whether it is or is not marked with a stop sign. All traffic **MUST** stop.



You **MUST STOP** on roadways with ridged/grooved dividers.
